The Utah Sudden Cardiac Arrest Survival Act (H.B. 31) requires a person who owns or leases an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) to report certain information including the location of, or removal of, the AED, to the emergency medical dispatch center that provides emergency dispatch services for that area, within 30 days of acquisition of the defibrillator. The act provides for expiration of the AED statewide database on September 1, 2009, and replaces it with local systems operated by emergency medical dispatch centers meaning a public safety answering point (PSAP); referred to in Tooele County as the Tooele County 911 Dispatch Center. The Tooele County 911 Dispatch Center may disclose the exact location (s) of the closest AED if a medical need arises. 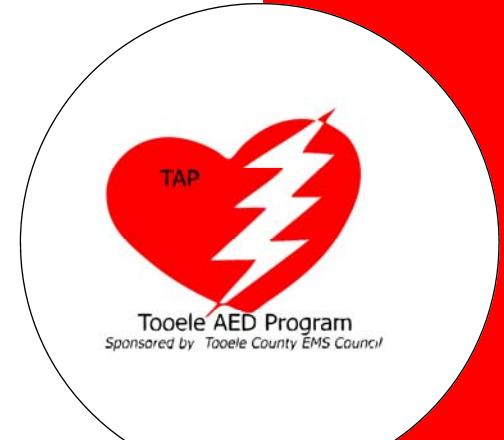

TAP Program



In 2008, a state law known as the Utah Cardiac Survival Act, was created requiring business or individuals who own or possess an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED), which is available for public use, to register it with their local 911 dispatching center.

Upon enactment of the Utah Cardiac Survival Act, the Tooele County EMS Regional Committee, created a task force sponsored by Tooele County, to ensure that any AEDs which are available for public use, have been calibrated and maintained to current EYCK CPR Guidelines.

Qualification for inclusion in Program

The AED is **available for public use** in either a commercial, governmental or residential setting.

The AED is currently registered and in good standing with the Tooele County Sheriff's Office Dispatch.

The AED meets ECC 2010 standards / guidelines.

Organization has disclosed all information related to the location of the unit.

Organization or individual commits to informing dispatch within 30 days of the unit being removed from service or becoming unavailable for public use.

Good Standing: AED Unit or Organization

Contact Person (Name, Address, Phone Number, Exact Location)

Operating condition (Meets ECC Qualifications)

Training program offered by organization.

Public Use – The AED is freely accessible to the lay responder to access during normal business hours.

Actions/Inactions causing exclusion in Program

If at any time a (AED) unit is found to violate any of the above mentioned policies for inclusion into the program it will be removed from the active list of available resources. At such time dispatchers may alert emergency callers to the location of the unit however will inform them that they will not guarantee the working condition of the AED.

Calibration and Maintenance

Organization commits to maintaining unit in functioning condition, by purchasing new batteries and pads as dictated by industry standards.

Organization commits to calibrating the unit to national standards.

Representatives from the EMS AED Regional Taskforce will conduct an annual inspection and assist in providing necessary maintenance.

Training Agreement by participating organization or individual

Any Organization who participates in the program will make staff available for a ECC compliant train the trainer program on annual basis or as deemed necessary by national guidelines.

Any Organization who participates will train at least 50% of staff on the necessary steps to use an AED.

Training provided by Tooele County to program participants

Representatives from the Tooele County EMS Regional Committee will conduct an annual train the trainer program for program participants
